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What is Mold?

Mold thrives in areas with high humidity and full of moisture. For mold to spread and survive it needs a food source such as cellulose. Common examples found in homes or businesses would be drywall or wood.

Excess moisture and standing water contribute to the growth of mold in homes and other buildings. When returning to a home that has been flooded, be aware that mold may be present and may be a health risk for your family.

Why Mold Mitigation isn't something to put off!

Asthma, allergies, or other breathing conditions may be more sensitive to mold. Immune suppression (those fighting cancer taking chemotherapy, HIV infection and those who have received an organ transplant) are more susceptible to mold infections.

Sensitivity to mold may cause stuffy nose, irritated eyes, wheezing, or skin irritation. Allergic reactions to mold may cause difficulty in breathing and shortness of breath. If you or your family members have health problems after exposure to mold, contact your doctor or other health care provider immediately!

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
